

Shibashis Chatterjee, Ph.D. is a Professor in the Department of International Relations at Jadavpur University, Kolkata, specializing in International Relations theory and its applications. He is the author of *India's Spatial Imaginations of South Asia* (Global OUP, 2019) and *Nuclear Non-Proliferation and the Problem of Threshold States* (Minerva, 1999), as well as the co-editor of *Peace and Conflict Studies: Perspectives from South Asia* (Routledge, 2020). His work has been published in leading international journals, including *International Affairs*, *The India Review*, *Japanese Journal of Political Science*, and *Economic and Political Weekly*. He has also contributed extensively to edited volumes.

A two-time Fulbright Award recipient, Dr. Chatterjee taught at Yale University and Indiana University in 2016–2017 and 2010, respectively. He has also held academic appointments at Makerere University (Kampala, Uganda) under the CODESRIA/SEPHIS Fellowship and was affiliated with the McGill/University of Montreal Centre for International Peace and Security Studies. Additionally, he served as the Hull Conference Fellow in the United Kingdom and has been nominated as the Eugenio Lopez Chair in Asian Studies at the Virginia Military Institute for the Spring Semester of 2025.

Dr. Chatterjee currently serves as the Project Director of the SYLFF Program at Jadavpur University, supported by the Nippon Sasakawa Foundation. Previously, he was the Director of the School of International Relations and Strategic Studies at Jadavpur University and Editor of the *Jadavpur Journal of International Relations* (SAGE).
